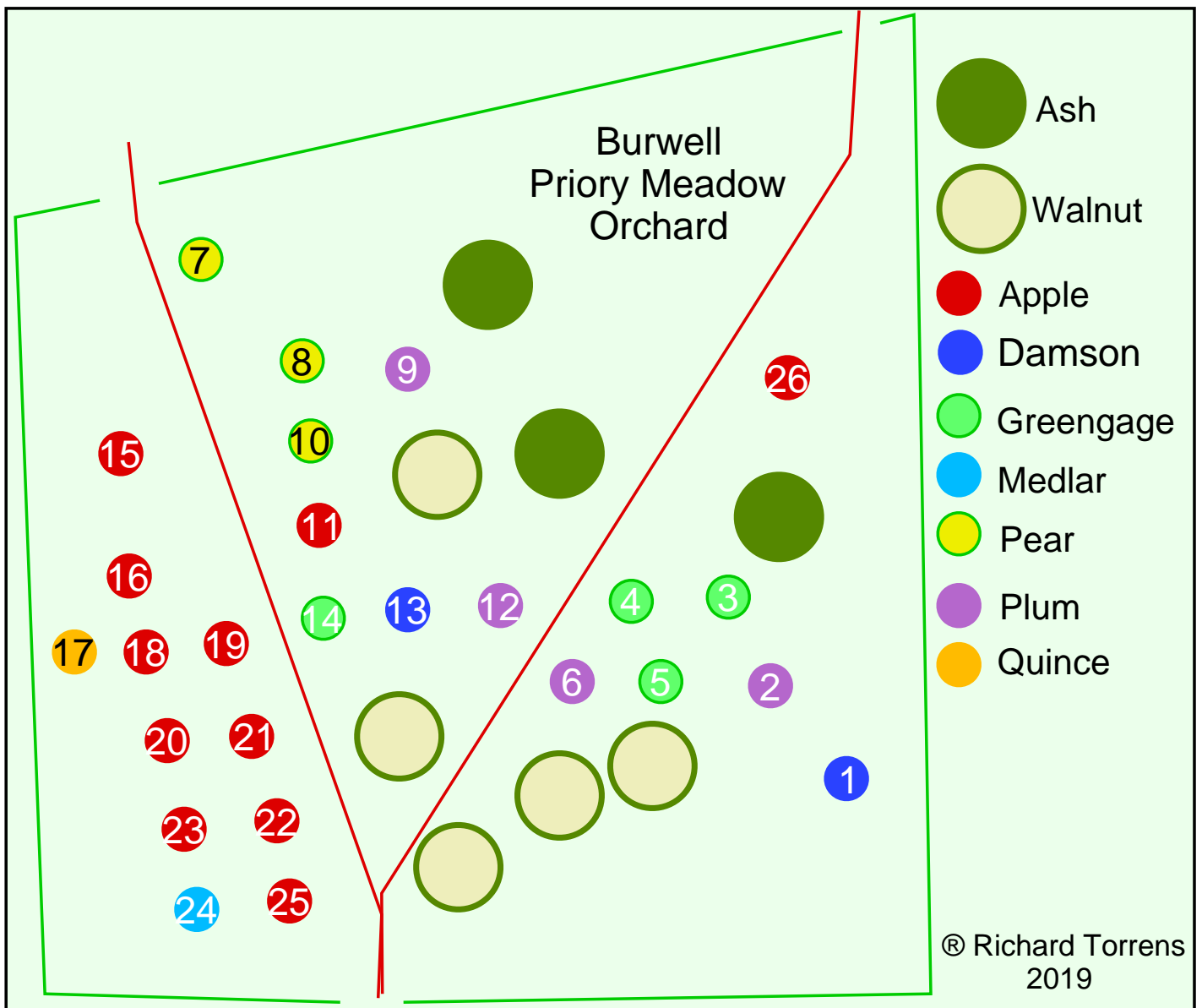


Burwell Community Orchard

| Map | Species | Variety | Rootstock | Label |
|-----|---------|----------------------|---------------|--|
| 1 | Damson | Aylesbury Prune | St Julien A | Late picking variety which is round, sweet and can be eaten fresh or used for cooking |
| 2 | Plum | River's Early | St Julien A | A good heavy cropping early season plum. Small bluish-purple. Good dessert variety when fully ripe. |
| 3 | Gage | Cambridge | Wavit | Small, yellowish-green juicy fruit, reliable. Good cropper, prefers a sheltered warm site. |
| 4 | Gage | Old Greengage | Brompton | Selected by the RHS for its excellent old fashioned flavour and more reliable crops. Partially self-fertile. |
| 5 | Gage | Willingham | St Julien A | Good cropping variety and excellent quality. Self fertile. |
| 6 | Plum | Marjorie's Seedling | St Julien A | One of the latest picking plums for September. Large and good quality purple fruit. Dual purpose. Good cropper. |
| 7 | Pear | Conference | Kirchensaller | One of the most reliable varieties. Yellowish-green with brown russet areas, occasional pink flush on chalk soil. Sweet, juicy and a good cropper. |
| 8 | Pear | Humbbug (stripy) | Kirchensaller | Green, yellow and pink striped pear. sweet and juicy texture with a thick skin. |
| 9 | Plum | Warwickshire Drooper | St Julien A | Large yellow dessert fruit, juicy and good for eating and cooking. Crops well and regular. Dropping (sic) habit. |
| 10 | Pear | Concorde | Kirchensaller | Pale green turning yellow, patches of gold/brown russet. Flesh sweet and juicy. Heavy cropping. Compact grower. |
| 11 | Apple | James Grieve | M25 | Red flush stripes over pale green. Crisp and juicy. Excellent flavor and reliable cropper - deservedly popular. |
| 12 | Plum | Yellow Pershore | St Julien A | A reliable cropper for dessert as well as the ideal bottling plum. |
| 13 | Damson | Aylesbury Prune | St Julien A | Late picking variety which is round, sweet and can be eaten fresh or used for cooking |
| 14 | Apple | Blenheim Orange | M25 | Yellow-gold with orange flush and red stripes. Nutty taste, crumbly texture. An old favourite - cooks, eats and keeps. |
| 15 | Apple | Egremont Russet | M25 | Flesh cream-yellow, sweet and firm with a nutty flavour. |
| 16 | Apple | Ellison's Orange | M25 | Striped, red, juicy apple. Aniseed flavour develops after picking, melting juicy flesh. |
| 17 | Quince | Meech's Prolific | Quince A | Large subtle pink flowers and very large, pear-shaped fruit. Yellow when ripe. |
| 18 | Apple | Bramley Original | M25 | A cooking apple propagated from the original Bramley tree. |
| 19 | Apple | Ashmead's Kernel | M25 | Pale green aromatic fruit with strong, sweet-sharp intense, acid drop flavour. Firm white flesh. Beautiful flowers. |
| 20 | Apple | Worcester Pearmain | M25 | Reliable crop of delicious orange-red fruit. Firm, juicy flesh is very sweet with strong strawberry flavour. |
| 21 | Apple | Ashmead's Kernel | M25 | Pale green aromatic fruit with strong, sweet-sharp intense, acid drop flavour. Firm white flesh. Beautiful flowers. |
| 22 | Apple | Laxton's Superb | M25 | Sweet and aromatic, similar to Cox. Purple flush, red striped, old fashioned. |
| 23 | Apple | Ribston Pippin | M25 | Sweet, aromatic, crisp fruit with yellow-red flush. Firm, deep, cream flesh, more acid than Cox. |
| 24 | Medlar | Nottingham | Quince A | Small, semi-weeping, flat topped tree. Eat russet fruits when fully ripe. Flowers large white with large hairy leaves, copper coloured in autumn. |
| 25 | Apple | William Crump | M25 | Green yellow with red stripes and orange-red flush. Rich, intense flavour. |
| 26 | Apple | Bramley | M106 | Well-known cooking apple |
